Happenings in Columbian Year 2003-04 (and a bit of 2004-05) *The Editor*

Right after our last Newsletter in **mid- March**, there were some truly sad news, when **Brother Harry Cooney** passed away; a large number of Brothers attended the wake, and the Funeral Mass. We carried on with the **Way of the Cross** (KICs Terry Howard and Max Ulyett), taught the **Rosary** to yet another class at **Notre Dame High School** (KIC Don Yantha), and held another **First Degree Exemplification**. For the first time in a number of years, we held a **Knights' Communion Breakfast** (KIC Brian Marley-Clarke), which was a great success; the guest speaker was Fr. Pierre Ingram, who addressed us on the **importance of the Eucharist in the life of a Knight**. A **summary of his address** is on page 3 of this Newsletter.

This brought us to **April**, and to the various celebrations leading to Easter Sunday. By mid-month, we had managed to get most of our new Members **exemplified into the Second Degree** in ceremonies at St. John The Baptist Ukrainian Catholic Shrine and at St. Patrick's (Fallowfield). Later in the month, the Grand Knight and the Recorder attended a meeting of the **KofC Archdiocesan Association**. We organized the third **Parish Breakfast** of the Columbian Year, which was a great success. Unfortunately, the month was marred by further sad news, when **Elna Ulyett**, wife of **Brother Max Ulyett**, passed away; a large number of Brothers attended the wake, and the Funeral Mass. Another class was taught the **Rosary at Notre Dame High School**, and we began **preparations for the annual Garage Sale**.

May led off with the **Garage Sale** (KIC Don Yantha), which went very well. The following day, most of our new Members were **exemplified into the Third Degree** in a ceremony at St. Patrick's (Fallowfield). This being a **Marian month**, we began the **leading of the Rosary** prior to each evening Mass. There were more sad news when **Brother Sid Hollingworth passed away**; a large number of Brothers attended the wake, and the Funeral Mass. Several of us attended the annual **Archbishop's Dinner**, organized by the KofC Archdiocesan Association. **Mother's Day** was busy - in addition to the usual **Roses for Life**, we also held a **Renewal of Marriage Vows** ceremony as an integral part of one of the Masses; nine (9) Knights and their spouses participated, with added colour from an Honour Guard. Congratulations to all! At the General Meeting, **elections for Officers for CY 2004-05** were held, and **Brother Brian Marley-Clarke** was elected as **Grand Knight**. The listing of other Officers elected is on page 6 of this Newsletter. Over the Victoria Day week-end, the **Grand Knight** and the **Recorder** attended the **State Convention** as this Council's Delegates - of note was the election of **Brother John Clancey** as **State Deputy**, replacing **Brother Bob Cayea**, and the election of **Brother Steve Caza** as **State Warden**. And the final class of the year was taught the **Rosary at Notre Dame High School** - in all, over 160 students were taught over the course of the school year, which is good work indeed. Well done, **Brother Don!**

And thus, as **June** rolled around, we arrived at the closing stages of this Columbian Year. Most of our efforts were directed into the **Steak and Awards Night**, with **Grand Knight Russ Allan** as **KIC**. The event was completely sold out, and was both a social and financial success. **Council and other Awards** were presented to meritorious recipients as an integral part of the proceedings. The detailed list of Awards and recipients is on page 4 of this Newsletter. **Brother Bernie Hurley** informed the Executive that his term as **District Deputy** of District 01 would come to an end on 30 June 2004; he provided your Editor with a letter to all Members, which is reproduced on page 5 of this Newsletter. Your newly-elected **senior Officers** began the planning for CY 2004-05, and more particularly, the selection of the key **Service Program personnel**, a process which was concluded over the summer months. A listing of these is also given on page 6 of this Newsletter.

In addition to a number of informal meetings of senior-most Officers, your new **Executive** met formally twice over the **summer months** to finalize the **program plans**, and to establish a **draft Budget**, for CY 2004-05. "The Eucharist in Action"

(The following is a summary of the address given by Fr. Pierre Ingram at the Knights' Communion Breakfast on 20 March 2004, as written by him; only formatting has been changed to achieve conformity with the standard format of this Newsletter - Ed.)

There is no opposition between liturgy and action, insofar as the Eucharist itself **IS** an action (not just words, not just a thing). In fact, it is an ordered series of actions. The most important ones are an imitation of the actions of Christ at the Last Supper. Their purpose is to transform the participants into the One Body of Christ.

1. Coming together to form the Church: The Entrance Rite

This is not something that we can take for granted, as Paul's rebuke of the Corinthians makes plain (1 Cor 11:17-34). If we allow divisions and inequalities to prevail, it is not the Lord's Supper we are celebrating, because we are nullifying the effects of the Lord's death! We must be a *reconciled* body in order to celebrate worthily. Social and economic distinctions must be set aside.

2. Listening to the Word of God: The Liturgy of the Word

We assume the posture of *disciples*, sitting at the Master's feet. As yesterday's Word is proclaimed to us in the Readings, and expounded in the homily, it becomes today's Word. Christ is speaking to us here and now.

3. Interceding as a royal priesthood: The General Intercessions

One aspect of our baptismal dignity is that we are qualified to offer prayers before the throne of God on behalf of the rest of humanity.

4. Presenting gifts: The Preparation of the Gifts and the Altar ("He took the bread/ the cup")

The gifts are not only the "fruits of the earth and of the vine", they are also "the work of human hands". They symbolize all the good we have done, from the most mundane tasks to the most exalted. This will form a part of the Church's offering to the Father.

5. Blessing/Giving thanks: The Eucharistic Prayer ("He blessed/ gave thanks")

Through the power of the Holy Spirit, invoked by the Priest by virtue of his ordination, the Church brings into being the memorial of the Lord's saving death and resurrection, which is nothing less than his very Body and Blood. This is our response to the Lord's command - "Do this in memory of me". Christ, truly present under the species of bread and wine, is then offered in sacrifice to the Father - "This is my Body, which will be *given up for you...* This is the cup of my blood ... it will be *shed for you and for all*, so that sins may be forgiven". This is the one perfect sacrifice, that takes away the sins of the world - but we are called to join ourselves to Christ in this act of offering.

6. Sharing in the Holy Gifts: The Communion Rite ("He broke, he gave")

The purpose of eucharistic communion is the *unity* of the Church as the Body of Christ. Receiving communion is a very different kind of eating: it is not Christ who is assimilated, rather it is we who are assimilated into him.

7. Sending forth: The Final Blessing and Dismissal

We are dismissed (rather abruptly!) from the eucharistic celebration so as to become what we have received.

The Knights of Columbus are not the only Order of Catholic Knights in this world? In fact, there are **at least fifteen (15) different Orders:** **Knights of St. Columba** (United Kingdom); **Knights of St. Columbanus** (Ireland); **Knights of the Southern Cross** (Australia); **Knights of the Southern Cross** (New Zealand); **Knights of St. Virgil** (Austria); **Knights of St. Thomas More** (Belgium); **Knights of Da Gama** (South Africa); **Knights of Marshall** (Ghana, Togo, Liberia); **Fraternal Order of SS. Peter and Paul** (Gambia); **Knights of St. Mulumba** (Nigeria); **The Order of Our Lady Queen of Peace** (Mauritius); **Knights of St. Thomas the Apostle** (Pakistan); and **Diplomatic Order of St. Gabriel** (United Nations). There is even another Order operating in parts of the Southern U.S.A., the **Knights of St. Peter Claver**, founded in 1909, and structured much like us, with one important difference; it is open to both men and women! Including us, these Orders, operating in twenty seven (27) countries, are trying to improve communications and establish collaboration through an umbrella organization called the **International Alliance of Catholic Knights**, founded in 1980.
